Report of the Management Committee

For the year ended 31 March 2013

The management committee presents its report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2013.

Reference and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the memorandum and articles of association and the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued in March 2005).

Objects of the charity

The principal activity of the charitable company is the provision of play and community development in the communities of South Gloucestershire, North Somerset and Bristol.

The objects of the charity are as follows:

- To advance the education and development of children and young people through the medium of play and group activities;
- In the interests of social welfare to provide recreational facilities in particular, but not exclusively, for the inhabitants of Bristol, South Gloucestershire and North Somerset and the surrounding areas so that their conditions may be improved.

Statement of benefit to the public

Bristol Playbus Project provides services that benefit the public by raising the profile of play with children and families and promotes the importance of play and equality of access to play. The use of a play methodology helps children to learn new skills and develop their social networks. The aim of the work is to strengthen children's emotional resilience and improve the social capital of a community.

The organisation works with communities that have been identified as disadvantaged in some way either by indices of deprivation or problems with anti-social behaviour, this includes working with Travellers and Disabled children.

During the year we worked with over 3,000 children and delivered 337 sessions.

Organisational structure

The charitable company is governed by a voluntary management committee which is elected annually. Officers stand down at the end of each year but are eligible for re-election. Members who served on the management committee during the year are listed on the previous page. The management committee delegates the day-to-day management and operational activities to a team of staff, led by the Project Manager, Ruth Cornish.

Report of the Management Committee

Review of activities

Due to changes in the economic climate and the amount of funding available to support services such as ours this last financial year had a real impact on the project's income. This means the organisation is in the process of reviewing all of its structures to ensure that we can reduce the costs and still deliver a quality service to the children and families we work with. As part of the management of change process we have reduced our administrative costs by contracting out the pay roll and the financial record-keeping.

Improving and developing the quality of the service is vital to ensure that we are providing the children with a relevant service. We completed the second year of the Bristol Play Standards and we are committed to this three year journey of monitoring the organisation's performance.

The play team have continued to use the Bristol Award accreditation and have started to use the outcomes heptogram to monitor progress. The early years team have been using learning diaries to record the children's progress and comments from the parents.

This year we have started to regularly engage parents in all our sessions. The engagement of parents is crucial as research has indicated that good parent / child interaction is vital for positive outcomes for children.

This year during Traveller history month the organisation began a program of Travellers Myths and Travellers Health & Well-being projects (funded by the Emigrant Support program and the South Gloucestershire P.C.T.) working to improve the physical and emotional health and well-being of Irish Travellers. L.I.F.T. Psychology were also able to gain access to the community via this project. During the Travellers Myths project we worked with Irish travellers encouraging them to draw and make crafts to celebrate their lifestyles and culture. The project culminated in a display at the local library.

The Let's All Play Team have continued to deliver a program of inclusive play activities at the adventure playgrounds in Bristol, facilitating access for disabled children alongside the regular sessions.

The management committee would like to thank all of the staff and volunteers for their hard work which ensures Bristol Playbus is able to offer a high quality service for children and families: the members of the management committee for their expertise and vision that ensure the project has a strategic plan for the upcoming challenges. Bristol Playbus would like to thank all of its funders and stakeholders.

Reserves policy

The management committee have set a target of holding approximately three months' expenditure in reserves. This is designed to help the charity to continue to operate in the event of a drop in funding. At 31 March 2013 £51,319 was held as a designated fund (Contingency Fund) for this purpose.

The management committee has a reserve fund of £6,504 designated as a contingency fund for the vehicles.

For the financial year 2013/14 the management committee will use £30,000 of the funds to help with the restructuring of the project to meet the challenges caused by economic pressures and the changes in local government.

Risk statement

The management committee have considered the key risks facing the charitable company and, where possible, have taken reasonable steps to mitigate them.

Statement of responsibilities of the Management Committee

The management committee is required to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including the net income or expenditure, for the period. In preparing those financial statements the management committee is required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The management committee is responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The management committee is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The management committee confirm that to the best of their knowledge there is no information relevant to the audit of which the auditors are unaware. The management committee also confirm that they have taken all necessary steps to ensure that they themselves are aware of all relevant audit information and that this information has been communicated to the auditors.

Members of the Management Committee

The members of the management committee, who are also trustees under charity law, who served during the year and up to the date of this report are listed on page 1.

Members of the charity guarantee to contribute an amount not exceeding £10 to the assets of the charity in the event of winding up. The total number of such guarantees at 31 March 2013 was 8. Members of the management committee are members of the charity but this entitles them only to voting rights.

Independent auditors' report

To the members of

We have audited the financial statements of Bristol Playbus Project Ltd for the year ended 31 March 2013 which comprise the statement of financial activities, balance sheet and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

This report is made solely to the charity's members, as a body, in accordance with Chapter 3 of Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the charity's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the charity and the charity's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of the management committee and auditors

As explained more fully in the Trustees' Responsibilities Statement, the trustees (who are also the directors of the charitable company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view.

Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charitable company's circumstances, and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed, the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the trustees, and the overall presentation of the financial statements. In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the Annual Report to identify material inconsistencies with the audited financial statements. If we become aware of any apparent material misstatements or inconsistencies, we consider the implications for our report.

Emphasis of Matter

Without qualifying our opinion, we draw attention to the Statement of Financial Activities in the financial statements which indicates that the charitable company incurred net outgoing resources of £13,081 during the year and, as at 31 March 2013, the charitable company's general unrestricted funds totalled £47,711. After the year end, the charity lost a major source of unrestricted funding which typically contributed £30,000 to core costs. These conditions indicate the existence of a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt about the charitable company's ability to continue as a going concern.

Opinion on financial statements

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the charitable company's affairs as at 31 March 2013 and
 of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, for
 the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and

Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 31 March 2013

1. Accounting policies

a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006. They follow the recommendations in the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued in March 2005).

The charity has had outgoing resources for the past two years. Whilst it currently has unrestricted funds to maintain this shortfall, these are decreasing. Furthermore after this financial period the charity has lost a major source of unrestricted funding, which traditionally contributed towards core costs. However, the trustees are confident that there are sufficient funds to operate the charity in the short term, and they consider it appropriate to adopt the going concern basis for the preparation of the accounts.

- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable.
- c) Grants are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Grants for the purchase of fixed assets are credited to restricted incoming resources when receivable. Depreciation of fixed assets purchased with such grants is charged against the restricted fund.

- d) Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.
- e) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.
- f) Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity.
- g) Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the management committee for particular purposes.
- h) The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the charity in an independently administered fund. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable under the scheme by the charity to the fund. The charity has no liability under the scheme other than for the payment of those contributions.
- i) Depreciation is provided on all tangible assets at rates calculated to write each asset down to its estimated residual value evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Motor vehicles 25% per annum Computer equipment 25% per annum

Assets under the course of construction are not depreciated until the asset is brought into use.

young people to engage in inclusive play sessions. This programme was previously funded via Bristol City Council and has now been funded via the West of England Centre for Inclusive Living (WECIL). This programme has been running for a number of years providing a much needed

service to disabled young people.

Streets Active Restricted funding for this programme was awarded from

a variety of sources and enabled Bristol Playbus Project to deliver a series of sessions around the Bristol area to encourage young people to engage in a range of activities, including sports. This programme continues into

13-14 and has been very successful.

Purposes of designated funds:

Contingency Fund The Management Committee has earmarked

approximately three months expenditure as a contingency

fund. This amounts to £51,319.

Project Restructuring The management committee has allocated £30,000 for

the restructuring and remarketing of Bristol Playbus

Project.

Bus Renewal Fund The Management Committee had previously earmarked

£14,136 for vehicle replacement and repairs, however during the course of 12-13 financial year the bus needed extensive repairs and therefore this fund has been utilised to support this work. There now remains £6,504 to

support the vehicles in future.
